The differences between the Reprint Medlars and BRS Tagged entries are minuscule.

The two differences include:

1/ BRS Tagged entry places all the authors in one author field, while Reprint Medlars will assign each author their own field.

2/ Reprint Medlars will insert hyphens before each field, while BRS Tagged does not.
