#### COURSE DESCRIPTION

This conference has been specially designed for practicing neurologists, neurosurgeons, emergency medicine physicians, critical care physicians, hospitalists, neuroradiologists, primary care physicians, internists, nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, case managers and rehabilitation therapists who treat a myriad of stroke related conditions and diseases in their practice. The course directors, Rodney D. Bell, MD, Robert H. Rosenwasser, MD, FACS, FAHA, Carissa C. Pineda, MD and Pascal Jabbour, MD, Thomas Jefferson University Departments of Neurology, and Neurosurgical Surgery, have developed an agenda that will include in-depth presentations on epidemiology and treatment options for risk factors in stroke such as hypertension and blood pressure management, atrial fibrillation, acute stroke, sleep apnea, aneurysms, arteriovenous malformation, vascular diseases, antiplatelet therapy and anticoagulation for secondary stroke prevention.

The expert faculty will provide guidance to assist participants in applying new knowledge to their practices. The combined format of didactic presentations and case discussions will allow participants to observe and question the expert faculty as they discuss real patient cases, and demonstrate how to apply new information and clinical guidelines into their practices.

The ultimate goal of the 14th Annual Cerebrovascular Update is to improve the delivery of care for stroke patients by improving the performance of practicing physicians as they care for patients with stroke related medical complications. To this end, practice performance gaps have been identified in the care of this population of patients, and underlying needs in the areas of knowledge and translation of knowledge into action have been determined.

#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Examine the epidemiology and the risk factors for stroke, and implement preventative measures to reduce the risk of primary and secondary stroke.
- Formulate an appropriate treatment and management approach to blood pressure control for acute strokes, atrial fibrillation, and intracerebral hemorrhages.
- Analyze and employ into practice current pharmacotherapy data on anticoagulation and antiplatelet therapy for stroke management.
- Describe the emergency room protocols for triaging the stroke patient.
- Integrate existing prescribing, treatment and classification guidelines for stroke into their practices.
- Contrast existing and emerging endovascular diagnostic techniques to better recognize and treat patients who suffer from intracerebral hemorrhages, intracranial aneurysms, and arteriorvenous malformations
- Identify the signs and symptoms of stroke in the younger patient, and implement proper treatment protocols to avoid or reduce lifelong impairments.
- Identify new imaging technology and determine implementation strategies for screening patients for acute stroke, primary and secondary stroke prevention and risk factors control.
- Recognize common pitfalls in the management of the stroke patient that may increase the risk of litigation.
- Formulate an appropriate rehab treatment and management plan from the perspective of the stroke patient to address individual capabilities and limits to ensure health care outcomes.
- Summarize the impact of sleep disorders on the stroke patient and identify effective management options.
- Assess their individual practices in light of the information and discussions during the course, and identify specific strategies to implement as part of a continuing improvement process for their practices.
