ASAP is an after school program offered at PMHC that provides an additional learning and treatment environment for children between the ages of six (6) and twelve (12) who have been diagnosed with an Autism Spectrum Disorder or Pervasive Developmental Disorder (PDD). The goal of the Program is to enhance and the potential of each child so that they may function more independently and effectively in their home, school and community. Therapeutic goals and intervention strategies emphasize increasing social and communication skills, building reciprocal and interactive play and building positive (age appropriate) behaviors. Programming is based on learning principles and Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) and includes components of Sensory Integration and Floor Time.

Supports Coordination Organizations offer a variety of outpatient services for children with either a diagnosis of Mental Retardation of a 50% delay in cognition. If a child qualifies, s/he is eligible for Family Driven Support Funds, which can be used for a variety of things such as respite and camp. A family must apply on behalf of their child through the Central Office intake number and if s/he qualifies, then the family can receive case management services through one of the four centers listed below.

- Respite is free 24 hour emergency care for children (ages 0-5 only) for up to 30 days per year provided by YSI in two home style sites (see below). These centers offer a warm, loving home environment with trained and seasoned staff. Staff can give medications including nebulizers (but no feeding tubes). Relatives can visit with parent's permission. Parents can use respite for caring for a child or their sibling during a medical evaluation or a court appearance, or during job hunting or if the parent just needs a break. Some parents just use the preschool component to see how their child socializes in a preschool setting. Care can be for a few hours or a few days or overnight. The centers can sometimes be full, so a parent should call ahead of time to reserve a space. Telephone intake process includes proof of your child's immunizations.

Wraparound

What is Wrap Around?

Wrap Around is a behavioral health support service provided by a team that may consist of a Mobile Therapist (MT), a Behavior Specialist Consultant (BSC), a Case Manger and a Therapeutic Support Staff (TSS) Worker. The Wrap Around team helps the child in the location where they need support, for example at school or at home or both. Wrap Around Services do take at least 2-6 months to put in place, they are provided only through CBH contracted providers and paid for only by Medical Assistance. The child must have a psychiatric or psychological evaluation recommending Wrap Around. This child's service is re-assessed every 4 months. Families who have MA can contact a wraparound service provider directly or apply through CBH. This service is NOT provided through the Pennsylvania Department of Education.

Benefits

(including Medical Assistance)

- MA for Children with a Disability Known as PH95
 - MA(Medical Assistance) is medical insurance that may cover things that your child's primary insurance does not cover. You can use MA as your primary insurance or you can use it to supplement insurance you may already have. If your child is disabled you may want to explore obtaining MA benefits for him/her.
- What does MA pay for that m private insurance might not cover?
 - For a child, MA covers everything that is medically necessary. Among those services are:
 - **Wrap-Around Services--**Wrap-Around services give children with a mental health diagnosis home or school based behavioral supports and therapy.
 - Medical and Nursing Services-- MA can pay for medical or therapy equipment, co pays, deductibles, transportation to medical appointments, services from facilities that only take MA insurance, medical bills not covered by your insurance(from up to 3 months ago) and nursing services that are documented to be medically necessary for a child with significant health care needs. Note: MA does not reimburse individuals who have already paid for services. It reimburses providers who delivered services.
 - The Diaper Program-- Diapers are paid for by MA when a child continues to need diapers after the age of 3 due to his/her special needs.

MA is a <u>medical insurance program</u>. It is state funded and administered through the PA Department of Public Welfare; HOWEVER, it is NOT WELFARE. Once your child receives MA you will need to recertify his/her case annually, either over the phone or through the mail. MA Insurance is medical insurance for children who do not qualify for SSI because their family income is over the SSI income eligibility guidelines, or for children whose family income is low enough to qualify for MA. If you already have private insurance you can keep it and also obtain MA to supplement your child's coverage.

...a word about SSI:

SSI, (Supplemental Security Income), is a federally funded program which provides a monthly check and Medical Assistance for people who qualify. To qualify you must have:

- a disabling condition PLUS,
- meet the financial cut-off levels. The financial cut-off level for one person is no more than \$2000 in savings and \$800/month in income.

To apply, call 800-772-1213, or log on to http://www.ssa.gov.

How to apply for MA:

- 1. Call 1-800-986-KIDS (5437) to have a MA application sent to you.
- Fill out the application. Make sure to write "MA disabled child Category PH95," across the
 top of the form. This will alert the caseworker to consider the child for eligibility because of
 their disability.
- 3. DOCUMENTATION!!!! You will need to provide proof of everything you are saying about your child by providing copies. For example: proof of citizenship (a birth certificate), proof of identity (such as a government issued photo ID (school-issued ID card,) address (a utility bill), disability (medical or psychological evaluation written by a licensed clinician within the last 3 months.), proof of any income in the household, including income received in the child's name, and copies of any unpaid medical bills owed from the last 3 calendar months. -You will also be asked to show proof that you did apply for SSI or were rejected due to income. If you have not already applied for SSI you will be assisted to do this (see above"...a word about SSI")

- 5. The application will be forwarded to your local County Assistance Office. You should hear from them in a letter within 30 days about the status of your application. This letter will contain the name and phone number of the caseworker assigned to your child's application. They may need more information. Keep in mind that the state rule says that you do not need to go to the office at all for an appointment, you can phone, fax or mail information.
- 6. OR you can call PCCY at 215-563-5848 X 17 . PCCY 's Child Healthwatch Helpline will take your information on the phone, gather documents from you by mail or fax and send your application in for you.
