Thomas Jefferson University Hospital will host a webcast featuring a mini-Whipple procedure (a pylorus preserving pancreaticoduodenectomy) – the newest surgical procedure for pancreatic cancer treatment.

- The mini-Whipple procedure preserves the entire stomach, the pylorus and several centimeters of the upper duodenum. The procedure will be performed by internationally known pancreas specialist and Chair of Surgery at Thomas Jefferson University Hospital, Charles J. Yeo, MD, FACS.
- Members of the Jefferson Pancreatic Cancer and Related Diseases team will present information on how new imaging techniques, improved screening, early detection, and innovative therapies are determining how pancreatic cancer is diagnosed and treated.
